**SURVEY METHOD:**

The **Independent Voter Landscape Poll — November 2025** results are based on a hybrid (Live-interviewer and Text-to-Online) poll of 1,210 active voters statewide in Colorado, including 600 active voters registered as Independent. The sample is distributed to accurately represent active voters in Colorado statewide based on party registration, gender, age, education, region, and ethnicity. The worst-case margin of error at the 95% level for the full sample of 1,210 respondents is  $\pm 2.8\%$ . The worst-case margin of error at the 95% level for the sample of 600 registered Independent respondents is  $\pm 4.0\%$ . The poll was conducted from November 9 – 17, 2025, by Keating Research, Inc.
